RESOLUTION NO. 19-152 of 2019

A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF NORRISTOWN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING HANDICAPPED AND LOADING ZONE PARKING SPACES IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF NORRISTOWN; PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION OF ALL APPROPRIATE OFFICIAL TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNS AND NOTICES; PROVIDING THAT THE NORRISTOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT AND ITS DESIGNEES SHALL ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS RESOLUTION; REPEALING ALL INCONSISTENT RESOLUTIONS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Norristown has adopted Chapter 305 of the General Laws of the Municipality of Norristown which governs vehicles and traffic within the Municipality of Norristown; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 305 of the General Laws of Norristown states that handicapped and loading zone parking spaces shall be established or eliminated by Resolution of Municipal Council, and may be amended from time to time by authority of same; and

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Norristown desires to establish or eliminate handicapped and loading zone parking spaces that shall remain in effect until amended by Resolution of Municipal Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it, and it is hereby **RESOLVED** by the Norristown Municipal Council, and it is hereby **ADOPTED** and **RESOLVED** by authority of same as follows:

I. Handicapped and loading zone parking spaces are hereby established at 216 E. Fornance Street, 651 E. Basin Street and 1109 Beech Street in the Municipality of Norristown as set forth on Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as if set forth herein at length.

II. The appropriate official traffic control signs and notices designating the handicapped and loading zone parking spaces established herein are hereby authorized to be erected or removed.

III. The Norristown Police Department and its designees are hereby authorized to enforce the provisions of Chapter 305 of the General Laws of the Municipality of Norristown, including enforcement of the handicapped and loading zone parking spaces established or eliminated by this Resolution.

IV. All provisions of other Resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent with the terms of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the inconsistency.

V. The provisions of this Resolution are declared to be severable. If any part of this Resolution is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such determination shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

VI. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its legal adoption.

On July 13, 2019 the Municipality of Norristown received a request from Mr. Johnial Denby for a reserved handicap parking space in front of his property. Mr. Denby resides at 216 E. Fornance St. Norristown, Pa 19401. Along with his completed application and physician's certification of disability was a copy of his Pa registration card for a 2010 Mazda bearing plate #76739PD.

On September 26, 2019 I responded to the area to investigate the feasibility of allowing for a reserved parking space at this location. The property is located on the south side of the street, mid-block. There is available off street parking to the rear this property, with a driveway accessible from Boorse Alley. Allowing for a reserved parking space in front of this property would not conflict with any existing parking regulations outside of the weekly maintenance route, nor create any type of safety hazard.

Due to the extent of the resident's disability, the available off street parking for this property is not suitable for his use, it is my opinion that this request should be considered for approval.

On September 4, 2019 the Municipality of Norristown received a request from Mr. Anthony Henley Jr. for a reserved handicap parking space in front of his property. Mr. Henley resides at 651 E. Basin St. Norristown, Pa 19401. Along with his completed application and physician's certification of disability was information indicating that he owned a 2002 Honda bearing plate #KJB4831 and a copy of his person with disability placard and I.D. card #P22168V exp. 09-23.

On August 20, 2019 I responded to the area to investigate the feasibility of allowing for a reserved parking space at this location. The property is located on the north side of the street, mid-block. There is available off street parking for this property with a driveway to the rear of the residence. Allowing for a reserved parking space in front of this property would not conflict with any existing parking regulations outside of the weekly maintenance route, nor create any type of safety hazard.

Mr. Henley indicated that for him to use the driveway to the rear of the property he would have to enter the residence through the basement and then navigate the stairs to the first floor.
